Overview

The SailPoint Certified IdentityIQ Associate certification validates your ability to configure and operate IdentityIQ to automate the identity lifecycle, access rights, and review campaigns. It is intended for IAM teams seeking to secure and standardize onboarding/offboarding and compliance processes.

This training prepares you for the key concepts covered in the exam: IdentityIQ concepts, components, configuration objects, access governance, and operational best practices. The approach focuses on real-world scenarios (account management, access requests, certifications, policies) to connect each concept to practical applications.

You will work through guided workshops and demonstrations on an IdentityIQ instance: navigation, configuration, log review, and troubleshooting common errors. Course materials include: course handouts, a review checklist, corrected exercises, and a sample preparation guide (key topics to master, common pitfalls).

Objectives

- Identify the fundamental components and objects of IdentityIQ.
- Configure governance elements: requests, roles, and policies.
- Run and interpret certification campaigns and their results.
- Analyze logs and diagnose configuration issues.
- Apply security and operational best practices for IAM.

Prerequisites

- Basic IAM concepts: identities, accounts, roles, permissions
- Understanding of directories and repositories (AD/LDAP) and target applications
- SQL Basics and Log Analysis
- Network and security concepts (authentication, authorization)

- PC with at least 8 GB of RAM (16 GB recommended) and 10 GB of free disk space
- Windows 10/11, macOS, or Linux with a modern browser (Chrome/Firefox)
- Access to an IdentityIQ lab instance provided by the organization or training environment
- Text editor, terminal, SSH/VPN client if required by the lab

Target Audience

This training is intended for both individuals and companies, large or small, wishing to train their teams in new advanced IT technologies or to acquire specific professional knowledge or modern methods.

Entry-level assessment

The pre-training assessment complies with Qualiopi quality standards. Teaching Methods
